

Dr. Thomas J. Oord, “Love and the Search for Meaning”

Thomas Jay Oord is an award-winning author with more than twenty books, including *The Uncontrolling Love of God: An Open and Relational Providence*. He is known for his contributions to research on love, relational theology, science and religion, and Wesleyan/Holiness/Church of the Nazarene thought. He won the Outstanding Faculty Award twelve times as professor at Northwest Nazarene University, Nampa, Idaho.

Raised on a farm near Othello, Washington, he graduated from Northwest Nazarene College in 1988. After four years in pastoral ministry in Walla Walla, Washington, he attended Nazarene Theological Seminary for a Masters of Divinity. He earned a Masters of Arts in Religion and a Ph.D. at Claremont Graduate University in Southern California.

While pursuing graduate studies, he was a part-time associate pastor in Bloomington, Ca. Oord taught philosophy at Eastern Nazarene College for three years. He joined the faculty at Northwest Nazarene University in 2002.
